Curate's letter

One of the stranger things I am asked to do is to stand in for Steven occasionally and write the Vicar's letter in the Frome Valley News. It's strange because you are writing your words and thoughts down at least a month before the publication of the magazine and gazing into the future is one gift none of us are blessed with. However if you read the newspapers or watch the tv news you are bombarded with pundits and experts who give out predictions on just about everything – the outcome of Brexit, who will win an Oscar, will Man City or Liverpool win the League etc etc. Of course no one can ever fully guess what the future will bring although personally I am confident that England will win the Six Nations Rugby and you reading this in March will know whether I am right or wrong.



Experience teaches us that we can never be certain of what the future will hold. Life has a habit of throwing up surprises and things happening when we least expect them. This of course is why many of us choose to hold so firmly to traditions and what we know can be trusted. The church offer some stability and continuity in this world when all around us is in a state of flux and change. But the church is not entirely immune to change itself; the increased interest in evangelism, the quest for 'more relevant' services, new forms of worship, a new Bishop of Hereford next year. Lent is a time for sober reflection as we approach both the great festival Easter and as we move haltingly towards spring. In the light of some of the huge changes happening to this country this year we would all do well to reflect on where we find meaning, comfort and truth. For me these words of scripture sum that up;

Consider the lilies how they grow: they toil not, they spin not; and yet I say unto you, that Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. If then God so clothe the grass, which is today in the field, and tomorrow is cast into the oven; how much more *will he clothe* you.



Moles - pest or pleasure!

This time of year, moles are particularly busy with their tunnel digging, as food supplies diminish. A sea of mini volcanoes may be the work of just one very hungry mole, living its largely solitary, nocturnal life. This tiny carnivore's larder would normally be well-stocked with 'ready to eat' earthworms - immobilised but alive.

Moles do help aerate the soil and will eat the larvae of insect pests. They themselves are food for other species, including tawny owls and stoats. Molehills are also a sign of a healthy soil - so a cause for celebration not a grumble!

Diocese news – March 19.

When you read this letter, I expect to be away from Hereford on a period of study leave.

Part of my time will be spent in Rome. I'll be looking at some of the churches there, noting how their own approach to prayers at the shrines of the saints compares with our own intercession ministry, back in Hereford. Do the saints in the Eternal City provide that focus of intercession that we so encourage in English cathedrals? For some of the time, I'll be staying at the Anglican Centre - set up during the 1960s after the historic meeting of Archbishop Ramsey and Pope Paul VI. The Centre provides a focus in Rome for dialogue between our two Communions.

I'll also be staying just down the road at the Venerable English College. This is the historic Roman Catholic Seminary for priests in training from England and Wales. Set up in the second half of the 16th century, during penal times, priests trained there often returned to England to minister amidst great danger and many were martyred for what they believed.

Since the mid 1970s, the College has invited two Anglican ordinands to stay at the college for four months of their training. I did this 1981-2 and Neil Patterson did the same 'exchange' a few years later. It was a hugely influential part of my formation – helping me to see how Roman Catholics were trained for priesthood and ingraining in me a real passion for Ecumenism, which has never left me. Indeed, quite of few of those I met almost 40 years ago, have remained friends. When I return this Spring to stay at the College, I'll be speaking to current staff and students and generally trying to get an understanding of how the ecumenical scene has changed in those years. We know that aspirations for corporate unity between churches has taken something of a back seat, as Christians have focused more on united social action – with arguably less doctrinal division. Nevertheless, discussions at all levels of our churches continue and I shall be particularly interested in the extent to which training for ministry contains ecumenical elements today.

When I was at the College in 1981, I was present at the great ceremony when the relics of the College's martyred saints were solemnly placed in a great bronze reliquary beneath the newly-consecrated altar. Such an event might have proved an occasion for disunity and blame – but on the contrary it proved to be a great ecumenical event – all united in the sense that the saints of all denominations lead us to God and give us a glimpse of his powerful working in human lives. Meanwhile, we all work in our own parishes and ministries to carry forward that great and loving command of Christ himself:

Ut omnes unum sint – That they may all be one

The Green Dragon at Bishop's Frome



A Brief History

The Green Dragon was named after a local dragon, well-known for its green credentials. It refused, for instance, to breathe fire on account of global warming. Unlike other dragons, it did not feast on the flesh of sacrificial young ladies, but ate a vegetarian substitute – Tofu Sacrificial Lady Shapes.

The pub was established in 896, in the reign of Athelstan. Unfortunately, beer had not yet been discovered. For the next hundred years, people would flock to the Dragon every day just in case it had been invented yet. This period, known locally as The Hundred Years Wait, is thought to have fostered the Green Dragon's reputation for good conversation. There wasn't much else to do.

Scandal hit the Green Dragon in 1346 with the unfortunate visit of Blodwyn the Unwelcome. History reveals that this Welsh Witch was thrown onto one of the pub's log fires. As she carbonised, she cast a spell on the place, condemning them, and everyone thereafter, to be friendly, gracious and welcoming to any visitor. The tradition persists to this day.

Bishop's Frome survived the Black Death by gathering at the Green Dragon and refusing to leave until it was over. (By this time, single malt whisky had been invented, and is still prized for its virtue in warding off illness.)

During the Civil War, the Green Dragon was defiantly Royalist, partly because of its philosophical belief in the Divine Right of Kings, but mainly because them Roundheads were stingy beggars who notoriously didn't like a drink.

History then stopped for the Green Dragon. There didn't seem much point in changing things. (The ill-fated experiment by a landlord to serve the 1960's dish Scampi in the Basket accompanied by Beer in a Mug made of Straw only emphasised the point.)

History made the Dragon what it is today – historically warm and welcoming, it's Herefordshire's neighbourhood pub.


