



Last, but definitely not least, a very big thank you to everyone who supported us.



Dear All

Although you'll all be aware that I'm standing in the General Election, I don't think it would be fair to use this column to talk about that – so I won't! I'll focus on the local issues that I continue to work on as your ward councillor.

The last Full Council meeting was held on 11th October. We had lots of members of the public attending again, which is always good to see! Councillors agreed to set up a review of governance arrangements to make decision-making more informed, transparent and efficient. I hope this will conclude that we should move to a more open and inclusive committee system. We also agreed to establish a new 'Mental Health Awareness Day' in January. (My son recently did a sponsored head-shave in aid of Mind, the mental health charity, so this is a cause close to my own heart).

The Council meeting also debated the Alliance's decision to pause work on the Hereford bypass while a full review is done. I fully support the 'pause' – indeed I think the proposed bypass is a waste of money. Building roads simply encourages more driving, and that's not compatible with tackling the climate emergency. Plus it won't actually address congestion in Hereford. I cycled to the Council meeting from the outskirts of Hereford (I left my car in the Aylestone Park 'park and choose' site) and I rode past 69 vehicles just on Aylestone Hill; all except 4 were cars, not lorries, and at least two-thirds of them had only one person in them, the driver. That's the real issue – too many single-person car journeys. To address congestion, we have to make it much easier for people to share cars, walk, cycle, and use public transport.

I've continued to do a lot of day-to-day ward work in Bishops Frome and Cradley, dealing with issues like bin collections, planning enforcement, highways issues, drainage, and a few housing-related cases too. I can't always promise to resolve everything immediately, but I will always try my very best!

It's always nice to be able to contribute to fixing a problem. Sometimes all it takes is a phone call saying 'I'm the Councillor for X, calling on behalf of Y, and I'm deeply concerned about Z'. One example is a recent case where I helped get a housing association to finally fix someone's leaking roof. Sometimes there's an endless trail of emails, and no quick solution; for example my on-going efforts to improve road safety at Ridgeway Cross. But it's a privilege to be able to try to help, at least, and I always do my best.

As you all know, one of my big concerns is road safety. We've made some progress towards setting up the Community Speed Watch Scheme in Bishops Frome, as the first few volunteers (including me!) signed up a few weeks ago. We do need more volunteers to make it work, though, so if you can spare a little time to help make our roads safer, please get in touch with Richard Ward-Williams: 07498 295152. Thank you!

This time of year always seems to bring a wonderful new David Attenborough series! Together with my kids I've been really enjoying 'Seven Worlds One Planet'. David Attenborough is an inspiration – as time has gone on, his environmental message has got stronger! As he says, we simply have to stop climate change, and protect nature. We can all make changes in our own lives, but we also need system-wide change: investment in the renewable energy, zero-carbon buildings and transport solutions that we need to build a better future. And the recent flooding has reminded us of what will happen if we don't stop climate chaos...

As the days draw in, I wish you all a peaceful festive season – warm inside your homes, hopefully not too wet outside – and a joyful Christmas and happy New Year!
