

Vicar's Letter

At the time of writing we are expecting to end all Covid related restrictions by 21st June. On the face of it that may be a great relief to us but it also carries with it a sense of trepidation for many people. People who have been isolated for their own sake or that of vulnerable loved ones will no doubt still be concerned. Coming out of lockdown may be, for some, almost as stressful as going into it.

The more I reflect on these strange times, the more I realise that many of us have got comfortable with a new normal that is far from what could be genuinely described as normal at all. How will we cope with being told we can get back to the way things were?

For the church I hope that this will mean that we can sing hymns for the first time in over a year and perhaps stay after services for a cup of tea or coffee. At the same time I am worried about other things such as sharing the peace and more so about receiving communion in both kinds.

I'm sure many of you would share my concern about receiving Communion wine from a shared chalice even after the 21st June. In the Church of England the way in which this element of the sacrament is received in a shared vessel is of great importance. Drinking from a common cup is a strong symbol of unity, and of a Christian's belonging to, and responsibility towards others and, not least, Christ. The cup from which the communicant drinks is not their own, but Christ's cup of self-sacrificial love.

In the current situation, there appears to be no obvious adaptation of the way in which the consecrated wine is administered that permits this key symbolic association to be expressed.

A number of people have asked if we could use individual disposable cups to receive Communion wine but a report by the Church of England states that this practice carries significant public health risks. Furthermore, there are practical problems with their liturgical use in the Church of England. This relates to any consecrated wine that may remain in individual cups after the communicant has received. Any remaining wine is consumed, usually by the presiding priest, after communion, this includes the practice of pouring water into the chalice and drinking it to make sure no wine remains.

If we believe that Christ is truly present in the bread and wine at the Eucharist then it would seem wrong to dispose of it in the bin in single use plastic cups.

For our predecessors at the Reformation the threat of pandemic was never too far away and they legislated for this eventuality in Church law. The Sacrament Act of 1547 notes that 'the... blessed sacrament [shall] be hereafter commonly delivered and ministered unto the people... under both kinds, that is to say of bread and wine, except necessity otherwise require.' It is these last few words that have enabled us to suspend the use of the common cup during the pandemic.

I will look closely at what the church advises on these issues closer to the time but I feel very strongly that nobody should feel under any obligation to receive wine from a shared chalice at this stage until we all feel it is safe to do so.

Included in the agenda will be reports from the Chairman and Treasurer, election of Trustees and a resolution **TO CONVERT BISHOPS FROM VILLAGE CENTRE (unincorporated) CHARITY INTO BISHOPS FROME VILLAGE CENTRE CHARITABLE INCORPORATED ORGANISATION (CIO)**

The draft resolution is shown below:

RESOLUTION TO CONVERT BISHOPS FROME VILLAGE CENTRE (unincorporated) CHARITY (registered charity number 507095) to BISHOPS FROME VILLAGE CENTRE CHARITABLE INCORPORATED ORGANISATION (CIO)

Whereas Bishops Frome Village Hall was established with a gift of land by Fanny Eveson in 1955 and became a Charity in 1970 under the terms of the relevant Acts of the day governing the establishment of an unincorporated charity with a Management Committee of trustees to run the hall;

Whereas the Management Committee, with a succession of trustees over the years since, has continued to run the village hall successfully as a solvent organisation in the interests of all the inhabitants of Bishops Frome and neighbourhood;

Whereas until relatively recently the only two forms of charity permissible under law were the unincorporated model run by trustees, answerable to the Charity Commission, and the incorporated model run by trustees who are also company directors, answerable to both the Charity Commission and Companies House;

Whereas a relatively new form of charitable organisation now exists in law, namely the Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), which permits a charity to enjoy the benefits of charitable status and the benefits of incorporation, without the burden of being subject to Companies House and Company Law;

Whereas without incorporation, a charity cannot enter into contracts or hold land in its own name and trustees are personally liable for the management of the charity;

Whereas in the 21st century, it is inappropriate for a trustee to be asked to, for example, take out a personal contract on behalf of the village centre to provide the centre with electricity or water, and the fact that concern over personal liability has been a factor limiting the recruitment of new trustees;

Whereas the Bishops Frome Village Centre Management Committee therefore decided at its meeting on 11 January 2018 to change the status of the charity from its unincorporated status to the new CIO status;

Whereas the Management Committee has convened a general meeting on Thursday 24th June 2021 of the inhabitants of Bishops Frome and its neighbourhood; The General Meeting RESOLVES that, in the interest of protecting the future of the Village Centre and its management, Bishops Frome Village Centre charity should convert to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation under the terms of the Charities Act 2006 and authorises the Management Committee to establish a new CIO for this purpose and to transfer the assets and liabilities of the exiting charity to the CIO in order to give effect to the incorporation.

ST. MARY'S CHURCH MUCH COWARNE

May is normally the month when we hold our Bring & Buy Plant Sale in the church, last year we were in lockdown and instead substituted a plant stall outside the gates of Panksbridge Farm, the home of Martin & Marlene Hewitt. As always and in hope of returning to normality, Marlene started planning and sowing in preparation for this year's sale but by the spring further restrictions on socialising made it obvious that if there was to be a sale some rethinking was necessary. Martin and Marlene therefore decided that this year the sale would be held at Panksbridge where there was an open sided barn where the plants could be displayed and also plenty of room and parking space for visitors. Unfortunately May 8th the morning of the sale, saw pouring rain but still volunteers came to help set up tables and put out the plants and by the afternoon the weather was better and from 2pm there was a steady stream of visitors. As always there was a big variety of shrubs, perennial and annual flowers and vegetables for sale, all from Marlene and other local gardeners. An amazing amount of almost £1,000 was taken on the day and further sales will raise that total. We would like to thank Marlene and Martin and all those who helped them or came to buy, for making the sale possible and enabling a very welcome contribution to church funds which have suffered so badly during the pandemic.



Our regular pattern of services (Matins on the second Sunday of each month and Communion on the fourth Sunday) has now resumed with the usual wearing of masks and with no hymns sung inside church, though we have finished our services by singing a hymn outside before departing. It is hoped that as regulations are eased we shall be able to sing inside church and even be able to enjoy coffee after the service.

The church is now open every day thanks to the efforts of those on the Key Rota and following the success of the two coffee mornings and book sales which we held before the pandemic, we are planning to have a permanent book sales table in the church with provision for people to make a donation for any books they take. We also intend to have a coffee morning on Saturday 3rd July to celebrate the relaxation of restrictions necessitated by the pandemic and hope that everyone in the parish will welcome and take advantage of the chance to meet and chat, enjoy a drink and some homemade cakes and look at the books for sale. Please look out for posters giving details.

It isn't possible as yet to say what, if any, further events we shall be able to hold this year, it obviously depends on national advice and the availability of people to plan and organise such things but any information will be in the Frome Valley News and the Community News.

Orchids in abundance

Take the public footpath from the churchyard that leads you up the hill and from early summer you should see the flower spikes of common spotted orchids. They give a glorious pale pink sheen to the slopes to your right. It is one of our most common orchids, but it is well worth close inspection, with its purple spotted leaves and delicate pink flowers with darker stripes and spots. You may find you are not alone in your botanical observations - day-flying moths are also attracted to the strongly perfumed flowers.

Remember to look out too for the pyramidal orchids on the flower-rich verge opposite the entrance to Moorend Farm.

OUR VILLAGE

During early May I had a long telephone conversation with Clive, a good old school and college friend, we had kept in touch spasmodically over all the years although our lives had taken significantly different paths. Whilst I went into Engineering, he went into the law and eventually became a successful Barrister in London (no prizes for guessing who had the more lucrative career), we spoke at some length about the time he visited me in Bishops Frome some two years ago, he had been widowed and had sold his house in London and downsized to of all things a Barge on the Kennet and Avon Canal to live in and a luxurious Camper Van in which he intended to travel and explore the birth countries of himself and his wife (England and Wales) because although he had travelled extensively abroad with his wife on both business and pleasure in his career, he admitted that his knowledge of the countries of his and his wife's birth was sadly lacking

On the day he left Clive and I had lunch at the Falcon in Bromyard, and he asked me if I realised just how lucky I was to live in a place like Bishops Frome with all it's amenities, many of which had once existed in villages he had visited but were now sadly no longer there due mainly to economic pressures, he was also much impressed by the friendliness and courtesy of people he had met in our village, being the gregarious person he is he spoke to several of the locals whether they liked it or not, and, incidentally he will be visiting again later this year to look at property in this area.(I have told him he will not be able to get his Barge on the Frome however)

So there you have it, I have to say it made me realise exactly how lucky I am to live here, I never originally came to Bishops Frome out of choice but I have to say in hindsight I am so glad I did, they do say familiarity breeds contempt, but absolutely not in my case, so if you are feeling nostalgic raise an occasional glass to dear old Bishops Frome





John spent 10 years in South Africa where he became fluent in burning meat – that's what Shisa Nyama means. Vusa is Zulu for 'fire and excitement'. Above all, he says 'this barbecue is a social gathering with the emphasis on community spirit and keeping us all together.'

And after all, that's what got us through this.


