

Dear Everyone

I am writing this from a very privileged position of being surrounded by fields and fields of sunflowers, almost ready to be harvested, yet I am acutely aware that writing about harvest this year is so different from previous Octobers. It has made me think very carefully about what we have all experienced as a result of the Covid 19 pandemic. Many of us have had to dramatically alter our lifestyles and expectations as a result of this ongoing global crisis; on a local level our farmers and growers have continued about their business and hopefully they will be rewarded with a plentiful harvest. Those not involved in agriculture may have reaped a personal harvest in picking of vegetables from gardens or



allotments. This produce offers very tangible evidence of harvest; from tiny seeds new crops appear; from our hard work we reap our own rewards.

However there are other harvests which are much less tangible but offer an equally important result. We can think of the considerable work of medical staff in our hospitals and surgeries as a type of harvest, a harvesting of caring and healing. Other key staff be they postal workers, telecommunications engineers, road hauliers, refuse collectors, emergency workers, retailers (the list is endless), all of them in their own way offer a harvest. Harvesting is a means of gathering in, of collecting together what can sustain us in the months to come. Living in a rural community we naturally think of farmers but we all in our own way offer something to a global harvest or gathering in. Let us celebrate and appreciate this joint contribution by giving thanks.

The list of harvest services can be found in this magazine and although these services will be slightly different this year, they all have the common theme of being grateful for what we have received, what has been grown, what has been achieved, what has been done. Harvest is a very good time to take stock of our lives, to count our blessings and to consider what more we might achieve. But it seems to me that God is right in the midst of all this activity and therefore it seems all the more appropriate to give thanks, despite the anxiety and, at times, heartbreak of the pandemic; simply saying thank you for what we have been given from others and from God.

However, if you are suffering, out of work or anxious about the events happening around us, the idea of giving thanks may not seem very relevant. Yet all of us have something to be thankful for, be it the comfort of friends or family, the help offered by others, or even just the fact that we live in such a beautiful part of the world. I am deeply aware of the uncertainty and hardship that this pandemic has brought but I am also impressed in how it has brought out the very best in many people. Let us look at the example of those who have given so much during these dark times and be thankful to them. That would seem to me to be the very embodiment of a harvest celebration.

We thank Thee, then, O Father, for all things bright and good, The seed time and the harvest, our life, our health, and food; Accept the gifts we offer, for all Thy love imparts, But what Thou most desirest, our humble, thankful hearts.

From Ellie Chowns

As I write there's still a bit of summer sun and warmth remaining – long may it last! I hope you all managed to get a bit of a break of some sort over the summer. I spent a lovely week in August cycling all around Herefordshire on my electric bike. Since tourism is part of my portfolio as cabinet member for economic development, I made the most of this opportunity to discover parts of the county I didn't know before, and talk to lots of people involved in the visitor economy. Tourism has such great potential to bring more investment and jobs to our beautiful 'green and delicious' county!



With September comes the return to school, college and university – including for my own kids. I'm so glad that our children & young people are able to socialise and learn together once again – it's so important for their wellbeing. I think we are all just very much hoping that we won't have to go back into lockdown. Of course that depends on all of us continuing to take precautions like handwashing, using a mask and distancing ('hands, face, space') to stop the spread of the virus.

With the gradual lifting of restrictions I've been able to get out and about in the ward more, including making site visits to respond to residents' concerns about things like planning and potholes. I'm pleased to report that we've been able to get some progress on addressing various local concerns, though the council officers are still under a great deal of pressure owing to the extra demands of Covid-19 response, and there's always more to be done... As always, please do give me a ring or drop me an email if there's anything you're concerned about – I am always happy to hear from you, even if it's a complaint!

Re Covid 19 news: There is new info emerging every day - This BBC site https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-51768274 is a good place for people to check the latest information for their local area. Currently the rate in Herefordshire is slightly higher than the national average, so we do need to be very vigilant still.

I've also been able to do a few site visits as part of my cabinet role. Just last Friday (11 Sept) I went on 'walkabout' in Hereford with Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government Robert Jenrick MP, plus Jesse Norman MP and other members of the Stronger Towns Board, to discuss ideas for Hereford's Town Investment Plan (which I mentioned in my July update). There will be a community consultation on this Plan coming up soon. In the meantime please do feed in any ideas you have here: https://mytown.communities.gov.uk/town/hereford/.

Also this autumn there will be opportunities to input into the development of the countywide Climate & Nature Action Plan 2030. As you all know, I am passionate about protecting nature and tackling climate change. Just last night the latest David Attenborough film on the BBC (Extinction: The Facts) reminded us why we so urgently need to tackle the biodiversity and climate crises. The council is playing its part – we've already published our plan to get to zero carbon by 2030, and we'll be publishing a Nature Action Plan this year too – but we also need to get everyone involved, all across the county – because 99% of the emissions and pollution and habitat damage aren't in the direct control of the council.

The council does have some influence over those wider issues – so for example I'm pushing inside the council for stronger planning policy to protect our precious Wye and Lugg rivers, and working to set up a major new housing retrofit programme to increase energy efficiency, reduce emissions and tackle fuel poverty. But we need everyone to play a part in this – whether that's taking individual action at home, getting involved in local environmental groups, or engaging your organisation. We can only become a zero-carbon, nature-rich county if everyone gets involved – businesses, schools, care homes, farms, and everyone else! I do hope you'll all get involved and make your voices heard over the coming months – I'll keep you posted when the consultation is launched.

In the meantime, I wish you all the very best – take care and keep well. Ellie

After a great deal of thought the decision has been made by the members to discontinue meeting at Bishop's Frome Village Centre. The members wish to thank all who have supported the club and especially all those who have cooked meals and helped to organise events and outings for them over the years. It was a difficult decision but all who have been connected with the club in whatever capacity will all have very happy memories.

ST MARY'S CHURCH MUCH COWARNE

By the time you read this we shall have had our first service in St Mary's Church since March on Sunday September 13 at 10.00am we had a socially distanced Matins service taken by Joan Rose, although there could be no singing and therefore no hymns we were lucky to have Judy Orgee playing the organ as usual so we had music to listen to. All the congregation wore the mandatory masks but Joan and the readers were able to dispense with theirs so that they could be heard clearly. For those who attended this service it was a most welcome return to our beautiful church and some kind of normality. The churchwardens will seek comments from those who attended the service and discuss with them and other members of the PCC whether they would like to continue to hold a similar Matins service on the second Sunday of each month until the end of this year. The intention would be to give the October service a Harvest theme, the November service would be Remembrance and December a Carol Service. Hymn singing may still not be allowed but the aim would be to decorate the Church appropriately for each service and to try to play hymns over the PA system as a token of normality. *These services might be effected by government restrictions.*

Although our services will be of the Matins format, Communion services for the Benefice will continue to be held every Sunday at 10.00am when, of course, social distancing will be observed. St Mary's Much Cowarne will continue to be open twice weekly, on Sundays from 11am to 2pm and on Wednesdays from 2pm to 5pm, for anyone who wishes to spend time in the church.

The PCC would like to reiterate that the pastoral work of the churches is not the only problem being faced as a result of the pandemic and all our churches are facing severe financial concerns due to the absence of fundraising events and collections from services. The PCC of our Grade I listed church has no hidden funds to pay for the upkeep of the church and it relies on regular donations and annual fundraising to keep it open and going. The churchwardens have recently put up notices in and around the church encouraging visitors and parishioners who have not already done so to join our Parish Giving Scheme. In addition to the secure donation box inside the church, a donation box is now on the wall by the Vestry door so that donations can be made when the church is not open. Currently our church is open for a limited time on Sundays and Wednesdays (as above) and we hope very much that people will take advantage of these times The church, even with safety tape, is as beautiful as ever and a good place to sit and enjoy the peace and sense of permanence which it imbues. The churchyard is still being kept trim and tidy and there are seats there to encourage visitors to sit a while and enjoy the views.

We would also like to remind you of the Frome Valley Pastoral Group which offers support to anyone who wishes to share in confidence any concerns or just to talk to someone, especially at the moment when we are not easily able to meet socially with others. 


