The season of Lent will soon be upon us with Ash Wednesday on 2nd March when we will hold our usual Ash Wednesday service in Bishops Frome at 7pm. The service is a Eucharist with the imposition of ashes in the form of a cross on our foreheads as a sign of penance. Last year we were in another lockdown and unable to hold this important service so please do come and join in if you are able.



Our Lent course this year begins on 15th March in Bishops Frome Village Centre at 7pm and will be very different from previous

years as we are looking at a live issue for the Church. This year we are following the Church of England's Living in Love and Faith course. Our Intern Ewan will be leading the course for us and we will be joined by others from the wider Bromyard Deanery.

The course will be asking "How do questions about identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage fit within the bigger picture of the good news of Jesus Christ? What does it mean to live in love and faith together as a Church?"

For many churches issues around human sexuality can be 'the elephant in the room' that we don't talk about and this shouldn't really be the case. In our own families, in our Churches, in our communities and in the wider world we find ourselves living within a diverse society. We don't have to agree with everything, but it is good to listen and learn from other Christians speaking about their experiences and beliefs.


As Heather's reading chosen by her from 2 Timothy put it so well, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith."

Bishops Frome Strawman How to build your Strawman Beacon Courtesy of those listed at the bottom of the page

Obtain the landowners's permission and involvement then ensure you locate your Bishops Frome Strawman at least 60m away from buildings, roads, railways and public rights of way, and a safe distance from dangerous materials and overhead power lines. Ensure it has good access for the transportation of materials for the bonfire and sufficient space for spectators to stand upwind. Liaise with your local fire brigade and all emergency services in your area, presenting them with your plans, and seek their advice and support. 1 Prepare site by removing top layer of turf and stack away from fire area. 2 Use only wood and straw for combustible materials and wrap steel banding around them all to hold the bales together while burning to stop them from falling away. Please dispose of the bands responsibly after the event. 3 Construct a safety barrier out of ropes and stakes or scaffold poles to ensure public is kept at a safe distance from the fire. 4 In daylight, and for several hours, and up to lighting, check that there are no children or animals playing or hiding in or round the Strawman. Arrange for at least 12 marshals to be in attendance, and undertake a sufficient safety briefing before lighting the Strawman. 5 The person looking after the fire should

flammability, and stout boots. They should know what to do in the event of a burn injury, or a person's clothing catching fire, and should have a fire blanket ready in the Strawman area along with a number of fire extinguishers. 6 Lighting: the safest and recommended approach is to use paper and solid firelighters in six places just inside the walls of the Bishops Frome Strawman to ensure an even burn. Never use flammable liquids such as paraffin or petrol to get it going as this can result in uncontrolled spread of fire or explosion. 7 To light the Strawman: from poles 2m in length, prepare hand torches for lighting with paraffin-soaked rags wired around one end. Remember, paraffin is dangerous and great care should be taken. Paraffin can be used as directed, but it is still dangerous and should at all times be treated with great care for example, always ensure all excess paraffin is drained off rags before use. If spilt on your clothes during the preparation of your Strawman lighting you should replace those items of clothing before approaching any naked flames. In particular, always remember to replace the lid on any container of unused paraffin and store it in a safe place away from naked flames. Do not use an accelerant on the fire itself.


What a wonderful start to the New Year here at St James Church.

ST MARY'S CHURCH, MUCH COWARNE

The beginning of February saw the completion of a project which has been many years in the planning: nicknamed "The Platinum Jubilee Ramp" it now enables wheelchair users to enter and exit the church via the porch and main door. Those who know St Mary's church will know that there is one step from the path into the porch and a further four from the porch into the church which is over two feet above ground level. The robust wooden ramp, which was started by Ted Parkes has now been finished to a high level of excellence by parishioner Don Sanders. In four parts, it will be stored behind the font just inside the door. Simple to set in place, it will enable wheelchair users not only to take part in any service at Much Cowarne but also to see and explore our beautiful and ancient building with its many interesting features. As the ramp will not be left in situ at all times anyone wishing to use it will need family or friends to set the four pieces comprising the ramp in place. On occasion of regular services there will usually be someone available to do this and it will also be possible to arrange with the Churchwardens to have the ramp in position if a private visit is required. It is intended to put the simple instructions and pictures for assembling the ramp inside the church.

Changes in our Conduction of Services

We are very lucky in Much Cowarne to have a number of people who are willing to read at our services and will always welcome more offers to take part in this way.

Hilary's Nature Diary

A flash of sapphire

A lightning streak of azure and copper and it can only be a kingfisher. How lovely to hear of a recent sighting along the River Frome from a member of our congregation. This unmistakeable bird has recently moved from amber to green, the best place to be on the British Bird List – a good sign but not a sign to be complacent, with growing river pollution levels in some areas.

The slow moving (normally) Frome, with its soft banks for nesting, is the ideal habitat for the kingfisher. Look out for the flash of sapphire as the bird darts from an overhanging perch to snatch its prey in the shallow waters. A Kingfisher's brood of 6 or 7 chicks can consume over 100 fish in a day.

That's a lot of diving!



Metal detectorists bring local history to life

In January and February, members of the Heart of England Metal Detecting group spent some time exploring the fields around the church – and what a haul. No sign of the legendary Castle Frome Hoard, but so many fascinating finds: Roman coins and cloak brooches, Elizabethan silver halfgroats, medieval spindle whorls, a c18th century silver shoe buckle, military cap badges, a hop token with the word Ledbury still visible and so much more. No hidden treasure but fascinating finds and they have further fields to explore.

Guidelines for awarding of grazing licence for field owned by Bishops Frome and Fromes Hill Parish Council, Fromes Hill Village Hall Trust and The Parochial Church Council as agreed by the representatives of the three parties

 All interested parties must bid by filling in the grazing licence and handing it in or having it delivered to Cllr R Partridge at the Garage, Bishops Frome

by Monday March 7th.

- 2. If there are more than one bidder, a meeting of the representatives of the three parties, should be held to decide on the award. This may be held by telephone if a real time meeting is not practical
- 3. If there are more than one bids, the highest bidder will be awarded the licence unless they have previously held the field and not complied with the rules therein.
- 4. The Parish Council will inform the winning bidder immediately and arrange for the signing of the licence. Immediately the licence is awarded, the winning bidder must pay the licence fee to the Trustees of the Fromes Hill Village Hall Trust, who are managing the processing of the payment.
- 5. The underbidders will be informed why they have not been awarded the licence within seven days of the decision being made.

The Council along with Cllr E Chowns would be interested in hearing from residents who would be interested in setting up a Car Sharing scheme. Similar schemes are in operation within the County and proving to be very successful. If you are interested to know more details on how the scheme works please contact Cllr Chowns and we will set up a meeting to discuss taking this forward.

It was agreed at the February meeting of the Parish Council that the offer to buy the Sports Field for the sum of £30,000 from the Eveson Trust should be accepted. Currently the Parish Council rents this field from the Eveson Trust. The Parish Council will apply for a Public works loan and it is currently envisaged that this should not impact the precept parishioners pay to the Council as one of the current public works loan has just been completed.

February 2022

Road safety has been a key issue for me locally in the past month. At my January ward surgery, a couple of residents came to see me about the A4103/B4214 junction, where there have been several incidents recently where cars coming from Ledbury have not stopped at the junction and have overshot and ended up in the ditch on the other side. I was really concerned to hear about this and immediately went to inspect the location. I asked Balfour Beatty (BBLP - the council's highways contractors) to



replace the missing 'Give Way' sign and to take other measures to improve the junction. I'm glad that a new Give Way sign was installed after a few days, but I still think more needs to be done, including replacement of the directional signs on the North side of the junction, an additional 'Give Way in 100 yards' sign on the Ledbury side. So I am continuing to chase on these issues.

I'm always really happy to meet residents and hear what I can do to help make the council work better for you.

My latest 'Sunday Service' was in Munderfield last weekend, where I litter-picked along the main road. I also reported several blocked drains and wonky road signs to BBLP, so I hope they will be dealt with soon. My next 'Sunday Service' will be on Sunday 13th March. Please let me know if you would like to join me litter-picking – the more the merrier!

The council held its annual budget meeting last Friday 11th February, and approved our coalition's responsible and moderate budget proposals. The council is feeling the effects of high inflation, just like everyone else, but we have kept the council tax rise to well below inflation: 2.99%, equivalent to 95pence per week for a Band D property. As I've noted before, two-thirds of our base budget is spent on social care for the most vulnerable members of our community (both adults and children). We are investing more and more in these services each year, while constantly looking for efficiency savings too. I've recorded a short video on my Facebook page to explain a bit more about the budget: https://www.facebook.com/CllrEllieChowns/

In last month's column I mentioned the £15 'Shop Local' card (https://www.herefordshire.gov.uk/shoplocal). I do hope you have all applied for a card, activated it, and spent it to support your favourite local businesses! Please keep hold of your card, too, as there will be an announcement coming shortly regarding a top-up to the money on the card J. This has been a really successful scheme that has helped local businesses bounce back from Covid.

I also mentioned the Herefordshire Citizens' Climate Assembly last month. This has now finished its work and presented its recommendations to the council regarding housing/buildings, transport, and food, farming and land use. The council has committed to take new action in response, and we have allocated this year's New Homes Bonus funds (£1.3m) to our 'climate & nature action fund' to support this. For example, one of the clear recommendations of the Assembly was to do more to help residents insulate their homes. I am personally very keen on this – it creates jobs, helps people keep warm, and reduces fuel bills, as well as helping save the planet! So I am very hopeful that work like this will be a direct result of the Citizens' Assembly, which was the most in-depth consultation the council has ever done. It was also really inspiring to see such strong agreement between people of all ages, backgrounds and walks of life regarding the need to tackle climate change and protect nature in Herefordshire. 




