

Associate Priest's letter

I am writing this letter during the middle of May with the lockdown still very much an all encompassing reality despite the lifting of one or two restrictions such as the opening of garden centres. We are all coping with this 'new reality' in different ways. Some of you may be dealing with this situation better than me, I do hope so.



I seem to have become a creature of habit over the last few weeks, sticking to an almost unaltered daily timetable and getting very grumpy if it gets changed. I guess this is a form of institutionalisation but it seems so alien from how I used to live my life. Others of you may not be faring so well and my prayers go out to you. All I can say is, this will not last for ever and by the time this magazine is published in June it may well be that further restrictions will have been lifted.

I am not a patient individual and I secretly envy those who are. But patience, prayer and fortitude seem to be exactly what is being asked of us all right now. And it is in prayer or meditation that many people have said to me that they have found comfort during this time. It is also notable how many people have watched the online and broadcast services that the Church of England has provided during the lockdown, even our modest offerings here in the Frome Valley Benefice have generated a following. Turning to God at times of national distress is well documented but the closure of churches has meant that people's search for faith and hope has had to have been met in new ways. Gatherings on Zoom, following services and reflections on YouTube, downloading prayers are all novel experiences but undoubtedly they are bringing those who are searching nearer to God and hopefully making them stronger in faith.

Covid 19 has brought out the worst and very best in people. Yes some people behaved selfishly to begin with but overwhelmingly we have seen good deeds, kindness, sacrifice and thoughtfulness. It would be wonderful to think that this glimpse of the 'Kingdom' will continue after we return to normal, whatever the 'new normal' proves to be. The last thing you need is another person telling you what to do, we get that every day in the Government Covid Briefing, but patience, trusting in God's love and the grace of Christ Jesus might be just as important as staying alert.

Total Produce, our wholesale grocery supplier, have been putting together a Community box that has a good supply of essential foods. The box costs £20. We can order these before 11am for delivery to The Hop Pocket the following day (not Sundays), usually by about 9am although that might change.

Waller butchers in Ledbury are happy to continue delivering to us twice a week, or more if needed, which means we can add in some meat if required, ideally we'd get about 3 days' notice on this

Frozen ready meals made at the Hop Pocket are available - at the moment beef lasagne, veg lasagne, Chicken casserole, Cauli cheese, and soups

The Foodhall will remain open Tuesday to Saturday 10am to 5pm and at the moment 11am until 4pm Sunday. We of course also offer cakes, biscuits, chocolate, beer, cider, wine, gin, maybe not essential, but we all need a treat!

Although this is a Worcester Number it was the nearest code available for this dedicated line just for our local community. The phone is always manned from 09.00 to 1800 seven days a week and outside these times the phone is likely to be answered although there is a facility to leave a message.

This initiative is provided by The Bishops Frome Village Centre to help support the community and will continue for as long as it is needed. We have a core of fabulous volunteers and have a list of others who have kindly offered their services if needed. Where a service requires someone to be DBS checked the appropriate volunteer will have a current certificate. You can be assured that we will always be available to help.

From the Bishop of Hereford

When my daughter was 16 we bought her a rabbit. We ended up mostly looking after it, and by mistake we got an extra long lived one, so we were saddled with it long after she left home! Every evening I would play out the ritual to get it (its name was Dumpling) from its run. Every evening was the same. The rabbit cowered in the corner just out of reach. I really had the rabbit's best interest at heart. There were foxes around. But for years he always treated my best efforts as cruelty. I sometimes wondered how I could help Dumpling to understand I cared about him. The answer, I concluded, would have been to become a rabbit. Dumpling could no more understand what I was doing than I can understand quantum physics.

That is a slightly frivolous start to a bigger question many people are asking. What is God doing in the midst of COVID-19? How could a loving God allow these things to happen? Christians have grappled with that question for centuries, every disaster bringing it back into focus. The cop out response is the Dumpling story. We really have no idea. The workings of the God of the universe are above our pay grade. Indeed, trying to explain why something has happened to those who've lost a loved one or a job, or suffering at home from domestic violence is rarely helpful. People sometimes say they wish the world was fair, not realising that if it was, every bad thing that happened to us would have to be our fault.

For Christians the resolution of the question is the simple phrase Good Friday. We may not be able to understand what is going on. But we hold on to the fact that Jesus becoming a human being and dying for us shows that God is intimately involved with us in it. The apostle John reflecting on Jesus said, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son". He doesn't stand aloof from human suffering but somehow works in it to bring good out of it.

Meanwhile, the Psalms give us ample language to rage at the apparent injustice and the pain of it all. Jesus used the words himself. And perhaps in that raw honesty we can be inspired to walk with those who suffer. Our silent presence often means much more that our explanations.

ST. MARY'S CHURCH MUCH COWARNE

Once again it is sad to report that the ongoing Coronavrus is still causing major changes to all aspects of our lives and whilst, at the time of writing, things have begun to ease a little for most, those of us in the "elderly" and/or most vulnerable bracket are still basically confined to barracks, or at least to areas which do not involve contact with other people or situations where the virus might be picked up. For this reason the PCC have decided that it is necessary to cancel the Church Fete which was to have been held at Tanhouse Farm on July 11^{th.} This is primarily because too many of those involved in organisation and preparation come into the above group but also because many who might attend would be reluctant or unable to do so and for obvious reasons a rainy day would certainly mean cancellation even if it had been decided to risk going ahead with the usual outside fete.

One event which we had assumed would be cancelled was, however, able to go ahead in a modified form: the annual plant sale held at the church had been planned for May 16 but with the weather in April being so warm, the plants which Marlene Hewitt had been rearing so carefully over preceding weeks were ready early and a Front-Gate Plant Sale was held at Panksbridge Farm for a week starting on May 1, with an honesty box for buyers to use and a plea to stick to social distancing. There were plenty of plants for sale and word soon got round so that, as the picture below shows, they did not remain unsold for long!



The sale raised a grand total of £426 which is an amazing result and many thanks and congratulations go to Marlene and Martin for arranging the sale and to those who came to buy.

It is hoped that we may be able to arrange another fundraising event before the year end but it will depend entirely on what happens in the next few weeks and months. Although our church building is closed we are all most appreciative of the arrangements made by Steven (using increasingly adventurous technical means) to bring us the services, prayers and readings for each week; and by Richard Allaway for the weekly Zoom meetings which he has established. On a more worldly front, those of us who are unable to shop or collect prescriptions ourselves would have been in a very different position without the help of those who are continuing to offer help with these – thank you all so much.

Keep safe, everyone, and be thankful that we are in the position of being able to enjoy the beautiful countryside around us and to walk where we are relatively safe.

Dear All

The council has done an amazing job responding to the immediate crisis – sourcing PPE, getting grants out to as many businesses as possible, housing homeless people and lots more. Over the coming months and years we will face some difficult decisions about how best to use limited resources – and we might also have some opportunities to do things differently and better.

Latest Diocesan News

Following a meeting yesterday, the House of Bishops has asked diocesan bishops to issue guidance on the gradual easing of restrictions on our buildings and activities whilst our church buildings need to remain closed. The following are our new permissive guidance for Hereford Diocese.

Incumbents, or rural deans where there is no incumbent, can, in consultation with their churchwardens and bearing in mind their specific location, appoint one person for each church in their benefice to enter that church building. The appointed person should be the incumbent or a licensed or authorised minister, minister with permission to officiate, churchwarden, or, where there is no churchwarden, one member of the PCC.

The appointed person should be entering the church building for any or all of the following

- •Pray the daily office and/or celebrate the Eucharist on behalf of the community they serve,
- •Live stream or pre-record worship,
- •Ring one bell to mark prayers being said or mark events (e.g. Clap for Carers, VE day anniversary),
- •Check the fabric of the building.

The church should be near to where the appointed person lives and he or she may be accompanied by members of the household with whom they are living. The door should be locked whilst they are in the building.

Consideration should be given to what cleaning will be needed to make our churches safe. Gates and door handles should be disinfected. Extra care should be taken for churches that have no running water. We expect further guidance to be issued later this week in this regard and encourage clergy to continue to check the Church of England website COVID-19 pages.

Clergy and lay leaders, especially those with underlying health problems, or who are shielding people in their household with such problems, should not feel under any obligation to do this themselves, nor should anyone be asked who is in one of the government's risk categories.

Our priority must be to act responsibly so as to safeguard ourselves and other people from infection. If you have any questions then please address them to Archdeacon Derek Chedzey or Assistant Archdeacons Stephanie Fountain or Simon Cawdell.

Please be assured that if you are content for the time being to lead worship from home, having set everything up to that end, you should feel under no obligation to switch back to the church. Likewise, it is perfectly fine to continue sharing services which are recorded or streamed by colleagues.

I hope in the coming weeks, if new COVID-19 cases and deaths continue to decline and subject to a change in Government restrictions, to offer guidance for opening our churches for parishioners and visitors to enter for private prayer. We long to open our churches for public worship and life events including funerals but I fear that is some way off. At present the restrictions relating to funerals across our diocese remain in place. We will continue to communicate via our weekly update including any changes as soon as restrictions are eased.

God's love in Jesus is unchanging but in these strange times we are called to learn new ways to proclaim the Gospel afresh in this generation.
